#### PROPOSED CHANGES TO AUSTRALIAN MARRIAGE CERTIFICATES

A review of marriage forms is currently being undertaken. These changes will **ultimately affect family historians.** The Commonwealth Attorney-General's Department is progressing a review of the approved forms made under the Marriage Act 1961 and Marriage Regulations 2017. The review is building on feedback from stakeholders, including comments received following the commencement of marriage equality in December 2017, as well as previous work undertaken by the department to streamline and modernise the forms. Submissions close on Sunday, 28 October 2018, so it is important to act quickly.

In particular, these items are currently collected and transferred onto Official Marriage Certificates. The proposed changes are removing several items, and consequently will no longer appear on Official Marriage Certificates, including:

- Usual occupation
- Usual place of residence (full address) of the "Parties (i.e. Bride and Groom)
- Father's name in full (If not known, write "unknown". If deceased, add "deceased")
- Mother's maiden name in full (If not known, write "unknown". If deceased, add "deceased")
- Children by previous marriage or out of wedlock

The removal of these items from the Form, means they will no longer appear on Official Marriage Certificates and will impact Family History Resources in the future, especially for our descendants. https://www.ag.gov.au/Consultations/Pages/review-marriage-forms-noim.aspx

#### SEARCHING HINTS - USE WILDCARDS

Using wildcards will assist searching various family history databases. A wildcard character replaces a single character and is interpreted by a search engine as something else. Helps find names that have been misspelt or wrongly transcribed, particularly useful when searching names that are commonly spelt incorrectly. When searching on Ancestry.com and Find my Past - a question mark (?) replaces one character whilst an asterisk (\*) replaces a string of characters. On the NSW Births deaths & Marriage index both the \* and ? operate as well as the @ which works as a soundex @colin will match Clune, Colan, Cullan, Callahan.
