

### VALE JEAN PURTELL 1928-2020

Local historian Jean Purtell passed away 24 July 2020. Jean speciality was the boats and traders of the Hawkesbury River and wrote several books including The Mosquito Fleet: Hawkesbury River trade & Traders 1794-1994. In the 1980s she wrote a newspaper column on local history and volunteered with the Oral History Project of Hawkesbury Library Service. Jean donated copies of her research, historical photographs and books to the Local Studies Collection.

# TOP 10 HINTS FOR FAMILY RESEARCH

Brief notes and websites from talk given to Hawkesbury Family History Group meeting

## TIP 1 - Basic steps

Follow the basic steps of family history research. Start with yourself, work backwards to your parents, grandparents and great grandparents. Verify information with certificates, church records, family papers & other sources. Use charts available at <http://www.hawkesbury.net.au/community/hfhg/forms.html> or Google fillable pedigree charts etc. Make sure you record and organise your research appropriately.



## TIP 2 – Photographs

Photographs are primary sources and may provide a wealth of information. May provide details of hair and clothing styles. Find images of your family in your collection, from family members. Also check collections of libraries, historical societies and Facebook pages. Also via Trove <https://trove.nla.gov.au/>

## TIP 3 - BDMs Certificates

Check BDM indexes and where possible, purchase certificates to locate more details. For details about Australian indexes see CoraWeb <http://www.coraweb.com.au/qs2ausbmdcosts.pdf> For UK FREEBMD <http://www.freebmd.org.uk/> and <http://www.coraweb.com.au/qs2ausbmdcosts.pdf>

## TIP 4 - Census Records

Census records are very useful for ages and also place a person in a place at a particular time and prove someone was alive at the time of the Census. Census records can be searched on Ancestry, Find My Past and also FREECEN <https://www.freecen.org.uk/> For background on NSW census and musters see <https://www.records.nsw.gov.au/archives/collections-and-research/guides-and-indexes/census-and-musters/guides>



## TIP 5 – Maps

Map your ancestors to put them in to context. Look for addresses from Census and other records etc in to today's Google maps. Some other useful websites are Trove <https://trove.nla.gov.au/> and Archives Maps <http://archivemaps.com/mapco/index.htm> & NSW Land records <https://www.nswlrs.com.au/Historical-Records-Online>

## TIP 6 - Cemetery records

Information headstone inscriptions can be useful. Details include name, date of death & age, possibly cause of death & occupation. Many headstones have been transcribed and can be accessed online. Some sites include:

## TIP 7 - Publications

Read up about topics associated with your family research. This might be simply reading an article on Wikipedia or in-depth publications. Read about places, notable people, architecture, medical history and learn more contextual information. Try the following:

## TIP 8 WW1 records

Service records can provide a great deal of informative information from attestation papers, medical reports and correspondence. Best sites to start with are National Archives of Australia [www.naa.gov.au](http://www.naa.gov.au) and the Australian War Memorial [www.awm.gov.au](http://www.awm.gov.au) Newspapers are also helpful <https://trove.nla.gov.au/newspaper/>



### TIP 9 – Repositories

Many organisations have their own repositories including government and privately run. Community groups and other organisations also have online presences. Worth checking their website and available material for research. The main repositories are State Records NSW [www.records.nsw.gov.au](http://www.records.nsw.gov.au) State Library of NSW [www.sl.nsw.gov.au](http://www.sl.nsw.gov.au) National Library of Australia [www.nla.gov.au](http://www.nla.gov.au) National Archives of Australia [www.naa.gov.au](http://www.naa.gov.au) Society of Australian Genealogists [www.sag.org.au](http://www.sag.org.au) Royal Australian Historical Society [www.rahs.org.au](http://www.rahs.org.au) and Hawkesbury Library Service [www.hawkesbury.nsw.gov.au/library](http://www.hawkesbury.nsw.gov.au/library)

Both the State Library of NSW <https://www2.sl.nsw.gov.au/eresources/> and National Library of Australia <http://eds.b.ebscohost.com/eds/search/basic?vid=0&sid=0af54054-558d-43c5-865a-edb1047f72a4%40sessionmgr101> have eResources which you can access for free with your public library card. They also are providing free access to Ancestry.

### TIP 10 – Newspapers

Newspapers are an amazing source with information often not found elsewhere. Particularly useful for Announcements, Obituaries, Reports, business info, background and social information and local history. Check out:
