
Hawkesbury Library Service will have increased operational hours, as of Monday 15 November as follows:

HAWKESBURY VOICES NOW ONLINE

Just a reminder to check out Hawkesbury Voices and some of our oral history interviews from our collection online at <https://amplify.gov.au/hawkesbury> Hawkesbury Voices captures the social and cultural history of the Hawkesbury through local stories and we are looking for volunteers to help transcribe them, so that more people can learn about the amazing stories contained in the Hawkesbury Voices Collections.



Using the innovative online tool called Amplify, developed by the State Library of NSW, anyone from anywhere can now search, listen to and transcribe some of digitised audio oral history interviews. A selection of our digitised oral history collection has been placed on the platform with a copy of the interview, as interpreted by a machine. Volunteers can assist by listening to the interviews and then correcting the transcription to help make them more accessible.

It is not necessary to log in, just go to <https://amplify.gov.au/hawkesbury> and select an interview. There are instructions, tutorials and FAQ on the site.
