#### **Margaret Catchpole news**

Our friends, Robyn and Penelope Sharpe have advised us of some news about Margaret Catchpole. Their UK friend Anthony Cobbold, 2X great nephew of Rev. Richard Cobbold who wrote 'The History of Margaret Catchpole, a Suffolk Girl' and a direct descendant of John Cobbold whose horse Margaret stole! He has advised of the display at Suffolk Archives, Ipswich UK - Behind Bars: Suffolk's Criminal Past, 24 October 2025 - 17 January 2026. 'Suffolk Legend' Margaret Catchpole headlines the exhibition that showcases her original letters, on loan from the National Library of Australia and State Library of NSW and on display in the UK for the first time!



The Cobbold Family History Trust (CFHT) preserves the archive of the Cobbold family, and includes the largest archive of Margaret Catchpole memorabilia. The CFHT is now looked after by Lord Henry Cobbold at Knebworth House, Hertfordshire. Both Anthony and Knebworth are keen to promote and protect the legend of Margaret Catchpole and are aware of her historical importance to Australia.
