Vale Fay Worrell 1930 – 2022

Fay Pye was born in 9 April 1930, her father Joseph was a lorry driver taking produce to railway. Fay had an older step sister Gwen plus a younger sister. She returned to Windsor in 1960 residing with her husband and family at Macquarie Street. She lived there for nearly 50 years. Fay was always interested in her community as well as the local Hawkesbury history and her family history. When the Hawkesbury Family History Group was established in



1982 at the Windsor Central Library, Fay was a keen participant and almost never missed a meeting. She also attended history classes with the University of the Third Age. Several months ago, she moved to Ron Middleton VC Gardens at North Richmond. She passed away 22 January 2022 aged 91 years old.
